
HANCOCK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER

NEIGHBORHOOD WILDLIFE HABITAT CHALLENGE

Hancock Neighborhood Association members voted at the May 20 meeting to participate in the Austin Parks and Recreation National Wildlife Federation (NWF) challenge to Austin neighborhoods to certify the most number of properties within their boundaries as wildlife habitats with the National Wildlife Federation. The winning neighborhood receives some prizes. The Challenge started April 15 and ends November 15,2009

Habitats that have been certified by NWF prior to April 15, 2009 cannot be included in this year's count. Meeting the criteria for certification by the National Wildlife Federation (NWF) will help HNA win the challenge and ensure that Austin maintains its status as a NWF certified Community Wildlife Habitat. All that is required to be certified as a NWF habitat is the following:

- Fill in the NWF Wildlife Habitat certification application; go to NWF's home page at www.nwf.org This is a tax-deductible contribution; once you apply, you will receive some extra goodies from NWF.
- Your yard must provide food (nectar, pollen, seeds, berries, etc); water; cover, such as evergreen shrubs, rock walls; places to raise young, such as nesting box and dense shrubs.
- Email or mail pictures and/or sketch of the habitat. Include \$15 (The \$20 mentioned on a city website is for some other program)

The habitat area can be any size; there is no percentage that must be dedicated to wildlife habitat. NWF does not come to your house to certify the yard and/or to inspect it.

The city has a small number of prepaid applications; contact Alice Nance at wildlife@ci.austin.tx.us and see if any are still available, and save \$15. HILL COUNTRY ALLIANCE

For some years I have served on the advisory board of the Hill Country Alliance, which is a non- profit organization focused on growth issues facing the 17 county area of Texas known world-wide for its natural beauty and ecological diversity.

The Hill Country Alliance is the most active regional voice calling for better planning in order to preserve the unique natural resources of this region for generations to come. Population explosion is putting the springs, creeks and underlying aquifers at risk as well as the flora and fauna that depend on them. Ninety percent of the land in the 17 county Hill Country is in unincorporated areas that is, in areas governed by county officials who have no legislative authority or tools to manage growth. HCA has created a conversation throughout the region to advance comprehensive planning where infrastructure, land use, natural resource protection, conservation and economic development are planned in concert.

The Alliance has completed an interactive GIS based website containing over 70 layers of GIS data for the 17 county region. This tool is offered free of charge to organizations throughout the region, county governments, landowners and the general public. Recently 90-second radio spots airing on Texas Public Radio KTXI, twice a day at 6:49am and 4:49pm.

GREEN HANCOCK


In an American Birds magazine poll of wildlife artists, the wood duck tied for third place as the most beautiful bird in the world. Male wood ducks are marked with patches of irridescent green, maroon, purple, and black outlined in white, a bright contrast to the rich beige of their sides.


In past centuries wood duck feathers were prized as decoration for ladies' hats. Their scientific name, Aix sponsa, roughly translates to "waterfowl in wedding raiment."

This spring these beautiful water birds gave Hancock the gift of choosing Waller Creek near 41st Street as a nesting place. Pairs of ducks were visible from the 41st Street bridge as they swam in the shallow water and in the mucky creek bottom hunting for insects.

Wood ducks were very common in America until the late 1880s when their nesting habitats, holes in tall trees, were destroyed as land was drained and cleared. They made a comeback after 1918 when a federal law was passed to protect them and volunteers across the US made wood boxes to serve as substitute nests. In Texas 22,000 wood duck boxes were put up from 1986 to 1984. Now there are an estimated 3.5 million wood ducks in this country.

As our neighborhood looks toward becoming a Wildlife Habitat, we might think about building wood box nests to attract more of these beautiful birds. Waller Creek just south of 41st Street is an ideal habitat for them and the 2-foot tall yellow-crowned night herons because of the overhanging trees and shrubs which protect the young from predatory birds.
